



Master degree in Waldorf Education

RUDOLF STEINER UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, NORWAY

The RSUC master's degree programme aims at giving its students real competence in practice based research. This study will be of particular interest to professionals having worked over many years in a specific field, for example, teachers, pre-school teachers, curative or social educators, eurythmists or principals, to name a few. It provides an excellent opportunity to deepen and share valuable experience.

3 year part time programme

During the three year master's programme, students and lecturers spend twelve weeks together on six taught modules, currently taking place at Vidaråsen Camphill Village, south of Tønsberg. In the intervals between the modules, students complete individual written assignments. The study programme comprises 120 credit points (ECTS) over the three years, corresponding to two-thirds of a full-time programme, making it possible to combine work and studies.



Language

All lectures and group discussions are in English. The Master's thesis and written assignments may alternatively be written in Danish, Finnish, German, Norwegian or Swedish.

Admission criteria

Applicants must hold a bachelor degree in education or having completed three years of educational training on an equal level, and have a minimum of three years of work experience in the field of education.

Application dates

1 March - for applicants with education from non-Nordic countries
15 April - for applicants with education from the Nordic countries
